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

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# Cliff Hanger

This Southern California captain takes his fishing experience to extremes

Competitive Salt Water Bass Anglers tourney fisherman Steve Greanias was practically born with a fishing pole in his hand. "I caught my first fish up at Mammoth Lakes when I was three," he says. "I'm not certain if my parents would have taken me fishing if they'd known what they were getting into." By the time Steve was a marine biology major he was spending 100 days a year fishing from the family's 2003 Crestliner 1800 Super Hawk.

"We bought the Super Hawk because it seemed to be a boat we could do a lot with, and it's turned out to be exactly that," Steve says. Although the family had long favored fishing the unspoiled alpine lakes on the eastern side of California's Sierra Nevada range, their new Crestliner encouraged open-water adventures. "When we first got the boat we intended to do a little coastal fishing, but right away we could feel how seaworthy it is." Before long, Steve was making runs out to what is now his favorite fishing haunt, the pristine Channel Islands, 20 miles off California's Ventura County shoreline.

"The boat rides incredibly well, even on a rough day," says Steve. "It doesn't porpoise the way some bigger, center console boats will. It sticks to the water." He says there is a treasure trove of calico bass, yellowtail, halibut and white sea bass waiting at the islands if you have the right boat and techniques. "I have a nice, wide platform and exceptional mobility that the bigger boats don't have. I can be very precise with the trolling motor and get into these coves and up by the boiler rocks where we're casting right into the foaming white water...right where the rubber meets the road, so to speak!"

Flirting so vigorously with the islands' ancient lava cliffs is delicate business, however, and even a hardcore pro fisherman and Coast Guard-licensed captain like Steve picks his offshore days carefully. "Some afternoons on the way back from the islands we joke that we need masks and snorkels, but the boat is totally capable as long as you have the experience and are careful about the weather."

On fishing for calico and sand bass in Southern California's premier saltwater tournament series, Steve says nothing drives you more than fishing against talent. "If you're just out there doing your same thing every day, you'll never get better. The series is very competitive and takes you out of your comfort zone. These guys are just phenomenal, and I'm learning new things all the time."

And during those tournaments it's certainly not the size of their boat that matters when it comes to the haul. Steve enjoys it when hobby fishermen on expensive rigs act "hoity-toity."

When Steve—who sells high-tech surgical devices to support his fishing habit—isn't threading white water with his Super Hawk or fishing competitively for sea bass, you'll find him floating the Crestliner up in the natural lakes of the Sierra, or playing on local reservoirs. "If you're going to have one boat in the garage, this is the one to have," he says. "I can be on an alpine lake fishing trout one day, and the next be 40 miles out in the mighty Pacific pulling tuna...and then turn around the next weekend and take a bunch of girls water-skiing on Lake Havasu. It's the do-everything boat!"

# Finesse Fishing

Pro Staff member Jason Durham opens up his angling playbook and offers tips on targeting walleye

Each May, the Governor's Fishing Opener celebrates the opening day of Minnesota's walleye fishing season. Nearly 100 of the state's premier fishing guides, in the midst of this huge party, are charged with putting the guests—including the governor—on fish. By the sheer numbers, somebody's sure to get lucky; but when it comes to fishing, luck's only a part of the equation.

Jason Durham, a guest host at the 2009 Opener and an integral part of Crestliner Boats' Pro Staff, knows the lakes surrounding his Park Rapids home well; what's more, he has the enviable ability to locate and catch fish on unfamiliar bodies of water—a huge asset for a pro angler at the Opener, which moves to a new lake and city each year. A 33-year-old with 18 years of guiding experience, Jason is not only a gifted fisherman but an educator, as well. (He teaches kindergarten.) Here, he offers some valuable advice on landing walleye in shallow water.

#### DO YOUR HOMEWORK

"Going out on a new lake can be intimidating," says Jason. Start with research, he suggests; buy a lake map, a GPS map card or simply view contour maps and fishery information online. "It's important to become acquainted with the lake in advance, even if you've never physically been there," he advises.

Talk to people with insight. Guides, bait shop employees, Department of Natural Resources staff and anglers who frequently fish a lake can all provide valuable information. Adapt their advice to your fishing style, Jason says. "Walleye are typically found in similar structural locations during spring, no matter where you're fishing in Minnesota or throughout their territorial range," he adds.

"Once you've located active fish, which commonly relate to shallow gravel or rubble flats in the spring, you merely need to coax them to bite." That idea—find fish, then tempt their taste buds—holds true throughout the angling season.

#### KEEP IT SIMPLE

"Live bait typically works best for walleye when exploring a new body of water, though crankbaits can also put some nice walleye in the livewell," instructs Jason. For live-bait options, Jason likes Northland Tackle's famous Roach Rig with a lively minnow, leech or nightcrawler as one of the more popular presentations for spring walleye. "Use a light weight—1/16 to 1/4 ounce—to slowly drag across the bottom; larger weights decrease the angler's sensitivity. And most importantly, make sure your bait is wiggling. A dead minnow, leech or night-crawler won't get you the trophy you're hoping for."

Another viable option: a Northland Fireball jig tipped with a minnow or leech. "Since you're commonly fishing shallow water for walleye, anywhere from 2 to 15 feet in the spring, a light jig is essential," he notes. Jason commonly grabs a handful of 1/16- to 1/4-ounce Fireball jigs for an early season trip, leaning toward the smallest sizes in the shallowest water.

Jason will also reach for a slip-bobber rig. "Since the boat is in constant motion while using a Roach Rig or Fireball jig, you're constantly moving to find fish. A slip bobber works best when fish have been located in a specific, concentrated area, like the declining slope from a shallow flat into a deep water refuge." The key to the slip-bobber technique, Jason says, is

to use a float barely large enough to stay afloat and make sure your bait is within a few feet of the bottom.

Guests head home in the early afternoon from the Governor's Fishing Opener, agreeing to reacquaint the following year. This year, Jason said his good-byes at the dock and headed out to fish again. "You never stop learning about fish and their behavior," he explains. "And the best way to catch more and bigger fish is to actually go fishing!"

# Forging Ahead story by Roger Kamholz

We go behind the scenes to find out how the meticulous Crestliner building process creates tried-and-true fishing boats

Like a white-hot fireworks display, the crackle and flash of searing metal fills your senses. You can easily get transfixed by the glowing embers, the shimmering surfaces of aluminum and the hum of craftsmen at work issuing from the background. Expert welding is one of the touchstones of Crestliner's production process, but there's lots more to see on a tour of the manufacturer's production facility in Little Falls, Minnesota.

Let's start back at the beginning. Crestliner utilizes only the highest quality marine-grade aluminum for building the hulls, stringers and other components of its lineup of fishing boats. The aluminum arrives at the Little Falls plant in huge rolled sheets—a far cry from the finely crafted fishing boats it will be by its departure. This is the raw material that is pressed, cut and molded into each component of a vessel's main skeleton. The intricate stringer system that's welded into a Crestliner's hull provides remarkable strength and resilience, allowing the boat to endure hefty doses of wear without missing a beat—let alone a fish.

Welding plays a vitally important part in Crestliner's production process, but that's also true of a number of other aluminum boat builders. Where Crestliner distinguishes itself is in the details. Some builders simply weld sheets of aluminum together; Crestliner custom-engineers special extrusions with tongue-and-groove channels that help marry aluminum sheets. The resulting seam is stronger—and it looks a lot better, too.

After the components are fashioned and welded together, the boat starts to take shape. You can begin to appreciate the subtleties built into the hull, such as the reverse chine. The chine helps a Crestliner plane faster and direct water away from the hull, keeping the crew dry. The extruded gunnels—another signature design element patented by Crestliner-eliminate the need for snap-on covers; Crestliner's "J" hook travel cover system attaches with no hassle. At this point you can also notice how the deadrise of the hull changes from bow to stern. The slope of the hull becomes more pronounced toward the front of the boat, which makes it plane quicker and handle rough water much more smoothly.

From the welding area, boats then move on to water testing, an important part of Crestliner's quality-control process. Hulls are lowered into a large tank and tested for proper construction and seaworthiness. Inspectors will climb all over a new hull in order to carefully examine it for structural integrity. No seam goes unchecked.

Once a boat passes its inspection, it's prepped and then moved to the paint room by a special overhead track system. Painters dress in masks



and full-body protective suits to execute the delicate work of applying a Crestliner's signature combination of hull colors.


Their protective gear recalls space travel, but more importantly, it reflects another element present throughout the Little Falls plant: safety. Technicians—whether they're welding a stringer system together, cutting aluminum parts or installing deck carpeting—are always wearing the proper protection. But more than that, everyone is looking out for one another here. Just as Little Falls is a tight-knit community, so is the Crestliner plant. Veteran workers watch over younger folks as they hone their craft. The result is a boat built by collective experience, a boat forged in close camaraderie.

There's a sizable lake trout, with its flank athletically pitched like it's still in the fight. Jamie Boettcher proudly points out a big rainbow trout; rainbows that return to streams to spawn, as they do on nearby Lake Michigan, are known as steelheads. Sounding like the nickname a boxer might gain after a career of stubbornly fought bouts, it's the perfect moniker for these battlers. How'd he catch them? I ask. Jamie replies, "Running spoons with downriggers, trolling."

Jamie has a way of explaining his setup simply, probably because for him and his family—consisting of wife Sue and their three kids, Danielle (13), Matthew (11) and Evan (9)—fishing Lake Michigan's deeper waters has become second nature. "We ran a fishing charter on Lake Michigan, out of Two Rivers," Jamie says. "We did that for four years." Their fully licensed charter service was called 5B's Sport Fishing. "As we got a little bigger and had some more clientele, we added the Crestliner." The boat Jamie is talking about is one we're in the midst of prepping for a Sunday afternoon of fishing, a rugged 2150 Sportfish that's surely seen its share of steelheads hoisted over its gunnels.

"It worked for doing small, two- and three-person trips," Jamie says, recalling his thought process in selecting the flagship of Crestliner's fishing fleet for his growing charter service. The Sportfish could do big Great Lakes water while giving three anglers the kind of real estate they needed to go after heftier targets. But there was more to the decision than that, Jamie says. "The big thing was that it's flexible, because the kids like to fish out of it, too." Not just fish; they're big fans of water-skiing and tubing. "They have a blast," he beams. "They love going cruising and having fun. Anytime they can get on the water, they're having a blast."

The Boettchers no longer operate 5B's, but they've hardly cut short their fishing hours—today being a perfect example. Jamie and the kids are busy grabbing rods and other supplies from the family's garage to load onto the Sportfish, which sits trailered in front of the house. Our destination is Lake Winnebago, the largest lake within the borders of Wisconsin, just a few minutes away. Being situated in Menasha, the Boettchers can enjoy the best of both lakes. On Lake Michigan, reachable in 45 minutes, "We fish trout, salmon—chinook and coho—rainbow trout, brown trout,

lake trout," Jamie says. Winnebago, which has a vast area but is extremely shallow for its size, offers a totally distinct fishing experience. Jamie sums it up enticingly. "It's primarily your walleye lake, your walleye water."

We drop in at a waterside park in Neenah, a wooded neighboring town and the place Sue spent her childhood. Our path will cut straight across the lake, toward where the water meets High Cliff State Park on Lake Winnebago's eastern shore. Once we round a jetty, the Sportfish jumps on plane and begins to make short work of the light, summer-weekend-afternoon chop. "We've been very



happy with the rigidity of the hull, just how it rides over a riveted hull," Jamie explains. "Just how solid it is, how it takes the waves. The boat absorbs a lot of that abuse. I love it." After the few-mile run, Jamie takes the boat down to trolling speed and the family readies the fishing gear.

The 2150 Sportfish, which the Boettchers purchased from Ken's Sports in Kaukauna, came stocked with a host of fishing features;

Jamie has further personalized the boat's trolling setup with downriggers and custom gunnel-mounted track system. Homemade wooden planing boards that float parallel to the boat multiply the number and increase the spread of the lines the family can have in the water at once. "When we're on Winnebago, we have the most success trolling stick baits like Rapalas and Shad Raps and crawler harnesses," Jamie says. "We've had a fair amount of success with those." It's an intricate setup, but once they have their lines deployed, the Boettchers promptly sit back and enjoy being out on the water. Warm sun plays on the lake's dancing surface and, in the distance, paints a vibrant green across the tree line. Jackpot, the Boettchers' playful English setter, happily trots from bow to stern, collecting hugs and pats from everyone. The smokestack of an old lime kiln-once used for making bricks and now a curious park attraction—rises from the shoreline like a lighthouse.

"We both grew up in families that were huge into the outdoors," Jamie says of Sue and himself. They're raising their kids the same way. "We do everything as a family. Hunting, fishing, all that stuff." Today the fish don't seem to be biting; perhaps the summer sun is slowing them down, too. But right now, with the Sportfish quietly crawling through the water and the lines taking care of themselves, a stretch of lazy downtime between catches seems hardly worth complaining about.

FISHING SEASON IS UNDERWAY IN MINNESOTA, AND CRESTLINER WAS THERE TO HELP KICK IT OFF

# When fishing season begins in Minnesota, IT ALWAYS STARTS WITH A BANG.

Each May, the Minnesota Governor's Fishing Opener kicks it off in grand style. This year the celebration took place on White Bear Lake, marking the first time the event was held in the Minneapolis-St. Paul metropolitan area. Hundreds of locals, tourists, sponsors and media representatives packed the town to partake in the revelry and witness the grand official start of fishing and summer tourism in the Land of 10,000 Lakes.

As an official sponsor, Crestliner played a prominent role, as it has for the past several years. "Crestliner was wonderful to work with," says Bill Foussard, chair of this year's event. "They have been a strong supporter of tourism and the Governor's Fishing Opener for years and years." Crestliner provided a new 2585 Grand Cayman pontoon that served as grand prize in a raffle in which ticket sales helped pay for event costs. Tom Weyandt from nearby Bald Eagle, whose wife had been hankering for a pontoon for years, turned out to be the lucky winner.

That pontoon was just one of several Crestliners to play a part in the celebration. "There were a lot of Crestliner boats around that weekend," Bill says. Crestliner fishing boats lined the docks of White Bear Lake, awaiting hosts and their special guests to hit the water for the day's fishing activities. "The governor did the official sendoff with everybody, then went out and caught a fish within a half hour. He caught four fish that day," Bill continues. Besides performing his official duties as master of ceremonies, the governor also spent time greeting local businesspeople and meeting locals of all ages. "He was very gracious, and he was into the day, into fishing," Bill adds.

Another new Crestliner pontoon was launched on the lake by Let's Go Fishing, a nonprofit organization that takes senior citizens out for free boating and fishing excursions. Let's Go Fishing opened its first Twin Cities chapter in White Bear Lake that weekend, its 20th statewide. "Our whole emphasis—not only that day, but every day—is touching lives and impacting people," says Joe Holm, who founded the program in 2002. "This is just one way thousands of seniors are staying active. Getting out in that fresh air is very therapeutic."

Like all the company's pontoons, this Crestliner was made with senior citizens in mind. It's handicap-accessible, with wide doors and seats that rotate 360 degrees to facilitate fishing, and it has a double bimini top to provide shade. The pontoon was unveiled in an afternoon ceremony attended by Jack Morris, former pitcher for the Minnesota Twins, as well as mayors from communities bordering the lake. "There was a tremendous excitement within the whole community, with Let's Go Fishing coming to town," Joe says. They christened the pontoon with a bottle of champagne before several fishing excursions; its maiden voyage carried

military veterans from the area.

"Many of them had not been on the water for years and were really looking forward to it," Joe says. "When they came back, there were smiles galore, and they wanted to stay out longer. They had a great time." One veteran turned 92 that very day. "And he said, 'I can't think of any better way to spend a birthday than to be out here."

The lake and town alike buzzed with activity. There were myriad community events, a golf outing, a picnic and a fishing excursion. Members of Crestliner's Pro Staff like fisherman Jason Durham hosted guests out on the water, helping them to land an inaugural walleye. The state's Department of Natural Resources hosted a kids and family fishing event at Lions Park. "The kids were just beaming, they were so excited," Bill says.

There was also a historic boat tour. White Bear Lake is often called Minnesota's first resort community, since it's been a tourist and fishing

destination for more than a century. In the old days, steamboats used to carry tourists to various resorts around the lake.

Of course, there was plenty of food at the event, including walleye fillets and steaks grilled to order. Meanwhile, various exhibits promoted the fishing industry or shared practical fishing tips. Minnesota's first lady even demonstrated how to clean a fish.


Joe, the head of Let's Go Fishing, was thoroughly impressed by the event. "It was really put together well," he concludes with a smile.
