



Brash Newcomers

The 1650 Fish Hawk and the Pro Tiller series join the Crestliner ranks, bringing incredible versatility, value and fishing prowess

Of all the seemingly impossible feats of the new 1650 Fish Hawk, the one that will likely earn the most praise is its ability to outperform the competition and still remain easily affordable for value-focused fishermen. From its incredible flexibility to its storage solutions to its practically boundless cockpit, the 1650 is extraordinary by just about every measure except price.

Climb aboard and you'll first notice the space. Crestliner maximized the 1650's 7-plus feet of beam to create an especially broad cockpit and strategically placed seat bases so anglers can freely rotate 360 degrees. "Not every fisherman likes to fish the same way," explains Steve Rock, product manager at Crestliner. "By opening up the cockpit, you really give them flexibility to maneuver and react to the situation at hand."

Speaking of flexibility, consider the 1650's versatile dual rod storage systems: The portside rod rack offers quick access and holds several rods up to 8 feet in length; for fully protected storage, a locking center rod locker contains seven tubes, each able to stow a 7-footer. "People

want their rods to be secure, but they also want them to be handy," Steve notes. With the 1650, "they have the best of both worlds." This boat is just as good at gobbling up the rest of your fishing gear, with spacious compartments located at the bow and stern for tackle boxes, lures, PFDs and other equipment. "There's a ton of storage—bigger compartments that aren't 'boxed in' as much."

The 1650 Fish Hawk's big stern livewell can accommodate a sizable catch, and its large access door makes it easy to load and retrieve fish. A 54-inch MotorGuide W55 wireless trolling motor and a Lowrance X-50 depthfinder come standard—providing the versatility and all the tools you need to switch gears from running to finessing your boat into tight spots and pinpointing fish. But that's not to say an exacting angler can't customize this rig. Options include a convertible stern bench, an extended rear casting platform with storage beneath, and a special crappie package. Three console choices are also available, from the open plan of a side console to the protected-cockpit layout of a Walk Through windshield.

Not content with just one fresh innovation, Crestliner also introduces its Pro Tiller series for 2011. The 1650, 1750 and 1850 Pro Tillers were specially designed to maximize the openness of the Tiller floorplan while minimizing the effects of wind and spray. Crestliner crafted a deeper hull with 17-degree deadrise and taller gunnels to provide more wind protection and a drier ride. The Pro Tiller can also house a 24-volt trolling motor system. To conceive the ultimate game-changing tiller platform, Steve and his product-development team enlisted Pro Staff member Jason Durham. "The process was extremely fun," says Jason, who is now using the prototype 1850 for his guide business. "We came up with a design that would suit the average angler, the hardcore tournament angler, the guide—anybody who wants to get out on the water and have a great experience."

Steve notes, "It's important to locate all the features of the boat within reach of the driver, and that's what we've done." The locking Command Console—housing vital controls and electronics—is located portside aft, opposite the starboard driver's seat. "This compartment will

hold up to a 10-inch screen or multiple smaller units," he adds. Whether you fish forward, aft or from the cockpit, you're near a bait source, rod and gear storage, and a livewell. "Because of the design of the boat, people don't have to move around in it very much," Jason says. "You can literally sit down in your seat and have access to anything you need at any time."





The Doctor is In

This M.D. turned Crestliner Pro Staffer uses the latest technology to scientifically snag walleye

Before Bruce Samson was known as "Doctor Sonar," he was simply Dr. Samson. Hailing from North Dakota, Bruce ran a successful family practice for many years—using every scrap of vacation time to fish. He left medicine in 2002 to fully commit to the sport. Now based outside Minneapolis and a member of Crestliner's National Pro Team, Bruce competes at walleye tournaments throughout the Midwest aboard his uniquely rigged 202 Tournament Series.

Asked about his Crestliner, Bruce responds first with a laugh. "My boat has been called the Starship *Enterprise*," he says. His 202's extensive suite of electronics lent Bruce his nickname among fishermen. "I found that electronics help me to catch more fish." Bruce uses a computer, GPS technology and sonar to precisely map the contours of lake and river bottoms. Displays at the bow, stern and helm console deliver all the incoming information so Bruce can make quick decisions on where and how to fish,

from any spot on the boat. He even has special GPS-guided autopilots that can direct the trolling and kicker motors.

"When you're on a new lake, they're very helpful," Bruce says of the gizmos he's added to his Crestliner. "The quicker you understand what the bottom of the lake looks like, the quicker you are able to understand how the fish relate to the bottom of the lake. Because fish are relating to something at all times. Sometimes it's baitfish; sometimes it's rocks, weeds. The sooner you put that picture together, the sooner you can start looking for other areas to find fish."


All that onboard tech backs up Bruce's most essential fishing tool: his boat. "I picked Crestliner for multiple reasons," says Bruce, who joined the Pro Staff in 2001. "The way the boat fishes, with versatile storage and mounting capabilities; the smooth, durable ride; and the people at Crestliner." Success with the new boat and sponsor came quickly; in 2002, Bruce won the coveted RCL Championship, held that year in Red Wing, Minnesota. "It was a nice drive home," he says modestly. (His winnings amounted to more than \$300,000.)

Bruce recently fished the Bay Mills Invitational Walleye Tournament held by Anglers Insight Marketing (AIM) in Brimley, Michigan. Crestliner is one of the sponsors of AIM's Pro Walleye Series and offered up a 1750 Raptor as part of the invitational's grand prize. Competitors follow a unique "Catch-Record-Release" (CRR) format at AIM tourneys in which anglers measure, photograph and release their catches. CRR benefits both anglers (no hassles with culling) and the environment (fewer fish kills). Bruce had a strong showing, but it was fellow Crestliner Pro Staff member Rich Boggs who took first place overall.

After the tournament, Bruce stuck around to volunteer at the kids' angling clinic. "I was teaching them how to cast," he explains. "Most of them picked it up real quick." The turnout was impressive; an estimated 200 children participated. He once again assessed his efforts with modesty. "I just volunteer my services and help out when I can," he says.

Some might scratch their heads at the thought of trading a career in medicine for dreams of chasing walleye, but it made perfect sense to "I picked Crestliner for multiple reasons. Bruce. For one thing, he's proven that his natural talent for fishing coupled with a keen grasp of fishing technology makes a killer combination. Plus, Bruce adds, "I have a chance to do what I love to do, which is be outside." He pauses a moment before adding, "and fish...enough. At the end of each year, I can actually tell you, 'I've fished enough.' Most avid anglers never get to say that."







Switch It Up

Looking back on Crestliner's 65-year heritage reveals an enduring commitment to building do-it-all boats Ohioan Frank Mohar relies on his family's Crestliner for just about every on-water activity, from pleasure cruises to pulling water-skiers. A tireless workhorse, to be sure, but the vessel also boasts some pretty stylish lines. And it's held up remarkably well over the years...all 55 of them.

That's right, the aluminum 18-footer is still on the water—Frank keeps it in Bay Point on Lake Erie—after more than half a century of use. Frank's granddad Joseph (who bought the '55 model new and used it to fish) passed it down to Frank's dad, Jack. "All four of my kids learned to water-ski on the boat," Jack says proudly. "We also did a lot of camping with it."

The Mohars are among countless avid owners who've passionately maintained and restored classics from Crestliner's deep library of past models. More than just much-appreciated flattery for Crestliner, their stories reflect Crestliner's 65-year commitment to durability, innovation and versatility—which is ever-present in today's lineup of boats. Crestliners boast spacious configurations and cutting-edge designs that cater to any on-water activity. Certain models deliver outstanding fishing features and



layouts that allow fishermen to target a variety of species; others give active families the freedom to fish, cruise and enjoy watersports with equal abandon.

Take, for instance, the stylish and athletic Sportfish series. With the patented Crestliner Conversion Bow, a Sportfish goes from athletic bow rider to serious fishing machine with a couple of quick cushion adjustments. Likewise, if you choose the optional Stern Conversion Bench, the aft cockpit can transform from spacious casting platform to comfy bench seat in seconds. Crestliner's popular Stern Conversion Bench option is now also available for the Fish Hawks and Raptor models.

Crestliner Super Hawks are just as multitalented as the Sportfish line. The 1800 Super Hawk I/O takes full advantage of its sterndrive power—and not only to give skiers and wakeboarders an air-friendly pull. Convertible aft seating helps expand the engine bulkhead surface into a cushioned sundeck, ideal for lounging.

Versatile seating is just the beginning. Several Crestliner models come in multiple console configurations, including the rugged boats of the Raptor line. Serious anglers have their choice of single consoles, dual consoles or full walkthrough windshields—each setup offering unique benefits. Fishermen who favor trolling and jigging will love the features of the Trolling Edition Raptors, while Casting Edition Raptors will satisfy those who value mobility, accessible storage and unobstructed casting room.

No question, the mark of a truly versatile boat is that it can easily shift from one activity to the next, keeping pace with the busiest family. But what do you call a boat that answers that same call of duty year after year, generation after generation? If you ask Jack Mohar, he'd just call it a Crestliner. Now that his 10 grandkids are old enough to start learning to water-ski, he couldn't be happier that they'll get to learn behind the same boat that pulled him when he was a kid.

As Jeff and Josh ready their lures, including the little speckled number known as Wonder Bread, Jeff explains their strategy. "We troll for walleye," he says.

"Each boat sets up six lines with artificial or live lures attached to boards. When you fish on the Great Lakes, always have at least one bait in the upper portion of the water column." Years of experience have taught Jeff to precisely weight and

let out line to create the perfect presentation while trolling—right above walleyes' heads. "Water temperature is pretty key," he adds. As it nears the 48- to 50-degree range, they trade cranks for crawlers; by fall, it's back to cranks. "I prefer night crawlers when the water temperature and conditions present themselves," Jeff goes on. Josh runs out the lines with the boards. Markers stand upright in the water to indicate all is ready.


Josh and Shawn scan the GPS and two Humminbird fishfinders. "GPS and fish-locator technology have come a long way," Jeff says. "Both are critical, especially when you're on a big water body like Lake Erie." Josh's boat is set for trolling with a bow trolling motor and a 9.9-hp Mercury kicker next to the burly 250-hp Merc. "This 202 has no trouble handling Lake Erie," Jeff adds. "I wouldn't be out here if I didn't trust this boat."

"Sweet!" Josh calls out as they spot a large school of fish on the Humminbirds. With the boards bobbing about in the chop, it's difficult to tell if there's a strike on the line. Jeff, a veteran walleye angler and tournament competitor, has been in this situation before and can keenly pick out a strike through the commotion. "Sometimes there's a subtle difference between how the other lines are moving and the rods are bending," he says. As we watch the bend of the rods, the play of the boards and the fishfinder screen, it's clear we're right over the target. Then,

off the port side, a board takes an irregular bobble. The trio springs into action, reeling in the strike. The catch confirms it: Walleye are below. Jeff quickly radios the other boats, relaying the catch size as well as the depth, lure and location. It appears these fish like white bread. Lively and glittering in the sun, the first walleye of the day goes into the 202's big livewell.

After more trolling passes and strikes, the boats head to another area Jeff knows to be a hot spot. He really makes fishing look so easy. "How do experience and luck play into fishing?" I ask him. "Nothing can beat experience," he tells me. "The more experience you have, the more information you can draw upon to enhance success. But luck always plays a part. Experience and luck are a great combination. Add in a great boat, like a 202 or a Raptor—even better."

Josh says he selected the 202 for its quality construction, the stability afforded by the wide beam and, of course, the excellent service he gets from Parkside Marine & More. "The store is only a half-hour from my house," Josh says. "I'd go in and buy bait. After about my third time there, I felt like they took me in as family. I grew up fishing with my



Josh reveals something telling about Jeff and his family business: He's not just selling boats, he's sharing his experience with his customers. "I think it works well, the way we present ourselves at the dealership," Jeff explains. "Having the knowledge and the ability to present the application is key for us. We utilize these fishing trips as training sessions when someone purchases a new boat. Not only can we help them use their new purchase with confidence, I hope they can also use it as a learning experience for their next trip. Not to mention, we have a great time."

Jeff much prefers to talk about fishing than himself. When we get on the topic of tournaments, he modestly says he usually fishes six or seven of the larger Midwest walleye tournaments per year. Josh leans in to say that Jeff has placed first in several pro tournaments. And Jeff doesn't just participate in tournaments as a competitor; for the past 12 years, Parkside has proudly sponsored the Richard T. Gaston Memo-



rial Walleye Tournament, which honors an Indiana State Trooper and a good friend of Jeff's who was slain in the line of duty.

I ask Jeff if his family fishes, too. "Not my wife; someone has to run the shop," he smiles back. "My daughters enjoy time on the water, for pleasure and fishing. I usually have a trip or two with my father, who flies in from New Mexico." After limiting out for the day, we head back to a fisherman's motel on the lake. The family-run place has rustic cottages and spots for campers. There's a pool and, more important, an area to clean fish. We lay out our catch, and other fishermen come over in awe. Ever the mentor, Jeff divulges where we caught our walleye, at what depth and with which lures. "Walleye anglers aren't afraid to talk," Josh observes.

Mike pulls out a fryer, beers open, and as the sun sets, the fish are filleted and cooked. Dinner winds down. I ask Jeff to share some wisdom he goes by. "With all this emphasis on equipment and catching fish, I think the most important thing we should remember is it's not about catching—it's about the experience," he says. "Learn something new every time you're on the water and you'll become a better angler overall."















The French River shuttles snowmelt westward from Lake Nipissing into the broad, outstretched arms of Lake Huron's Georgian Bay. Bob's family has been coming to this area since the early 1900s, when the only means of private transport was canoe. They traveled by train from Pittsburgh to North Bay on Lake Nipissing, then boated from there to campsites on the river. They fell in love with the area and later built summer homes hard by the water's edge. Bob, who grew up near Chicago, helped build one of his family's cottages when he was 14. Today, Bob and his brother John have homes on the French River, as do Bob's three

daughters and their families. All of them have Crestliners at their docks, all purchased from Giesler Marine.

Bob's wife, Carolyn, stood in the cottage's boathouse to meet us. In the adjacent slip was Bob's fishing boat, a 192 Tournament Series. A third space held Carolyn's Crestliner, which she's dubbed Bling Bling. The Allisons then took us on a tour of their cottage, which goes by the name Serendipity. Schoolteachers built it in 1939, and Bob has made a few additions and improvements over the years since acquiring the place. There's no running water or electricity besides what the Allisons generate themselves to power Bob's woodshop tools (he builds his own furniture), and a hand-operated pump at the kitchen sink draws water from the river. But for them, Serendipity

is just how they want it. A pair of binoculars—for spying loons and the occasional black bear—lives on the veranda, and they recently added a washing machine, also run off the generator. "And a solar dryer," Bob added with a smile, referring to the clothesline outside.

Bob's career brought him to Houston (he's semi-retired now), and the cottage provided the perfect escape from oppressive Texas summers. "When people ask us what we do up here, most of what we do is...live," Bob said. Their days are filled with fishing, cooking, fixing things that break and gathering for big family dinners. The day before we met up,

Bob took his grandson fishing for walleye in his Crestliner—and their catch was on the menu for the next evening's family dinner. "Walleye is the best eating fish there is," Bob said, his words hewn by that welcoming Texas accent.

Bob swears by his Crestliner, which the family knows simply as "Pa's fishing boat." He particularly appreciates its club seats and the trolling motor, which allows him to fish the river's tightest spots. He opened up the center rod locker and pointed out several cavernous storage options. "You don't have to leave anything behind," he said proudly.

As the day leaned toward afternoon, a cool breeze began to glide off the river, glass-flat following the morning storm. Later on, Bob took us on a tour of the river and pointed out his daughters' cottages as we passed. Surrounded by Provincial Park land, the river has few homes on it. It felt much like a neighborhood, with the river standing in for Main Street. And their Crestliners are, quite literally, their means of staying connected. We then headed down the river back toward the marina. As we parted ways with Bob, a faint drizzle began to fall, as if we were stepping back into another world.
